Tom and Toby Bozzuto Named Baltimore Museum of Industry's 2016 Industrialists of the Year

Baltimore, Maryland – Tom and Toby Bozzuto will be presented with the 2016 William Donald Schaefer Industrialist of the Year Award from the Baltimore Museum of Industry at a luncheon on Thursday, June 2, 2016.

South Baltimore is experiencing unprecedented growth, and the Baltimore Museum of Industry is privileged to have a front row seat to the exciting changes taking place in our neighborhood such as the forthcoming Anthem House development located just a block from the museum. With this urban renaissance in mind, the museum is pleased to award this honor to the Bozzutos. As leaders of one of Maryland's foremost real estate development and construction firms, this dynamic father and son team exemplify the commitment to economic innovation and community well-being that the Industrialist of the Year honor was established to recognize.

Since cofounding The Bozzuto Group in 1988, Thomas S. Bozzuto has developed or built more than 60,000 homes and apartments with an estimated value of \$14 billion. Like The Bozzuto Group itself, both men are also heavily involved in the city's philanthropic community and committed to public service – Tom currently serves on the boards of the Walters Art Museum, the Baltimore Community Foundation, and the Greater Baltimore Committee, and was previously a Congressional Appointee on the Millennial Housing Commission; Toby is active on the boards of the Kennedy Krieger Institute and the Gilman School, and held a seat for five years on the Maryland Health & Higher Education Facilities Authority.
