## Do

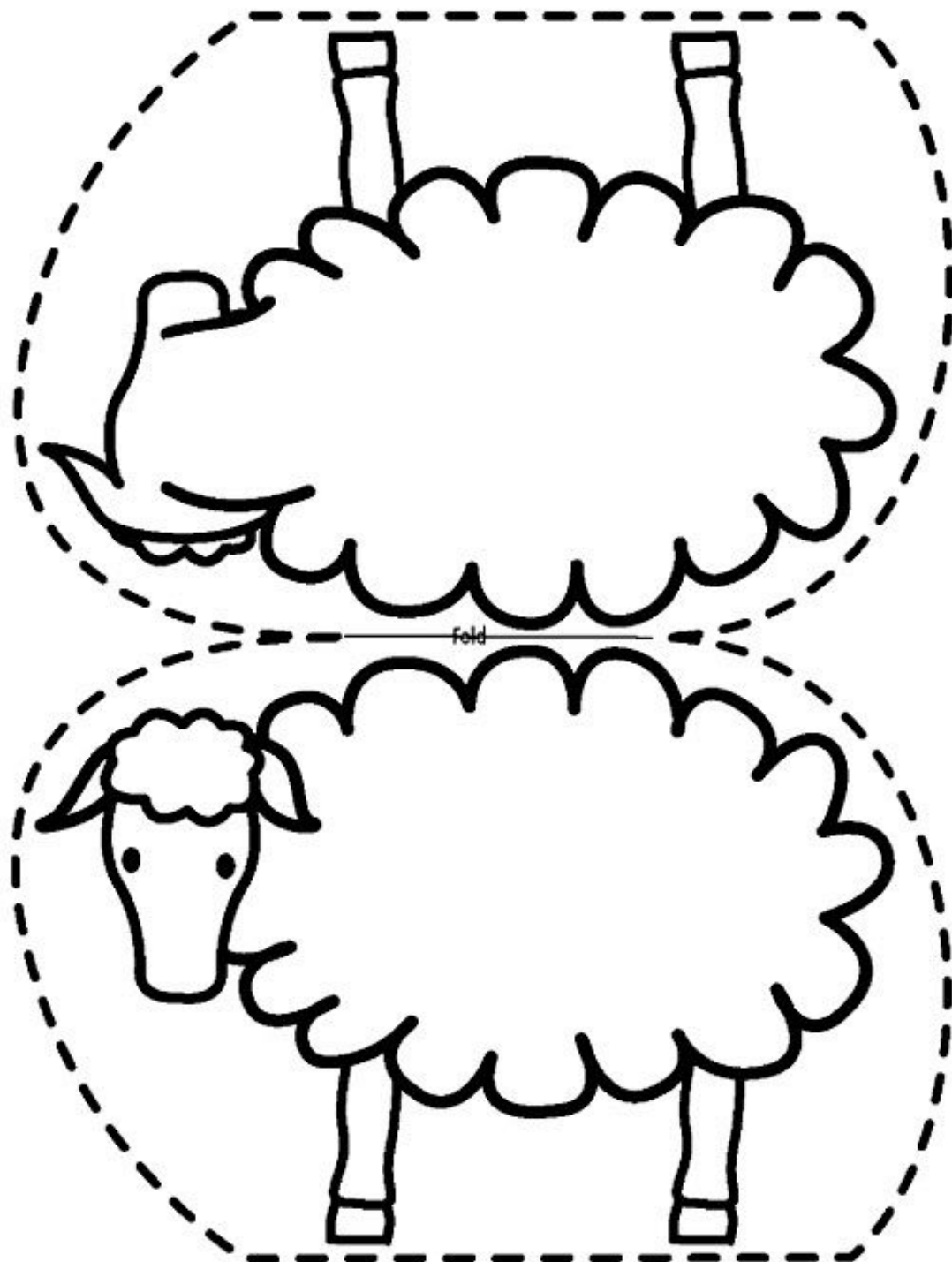
1. Design a little sheep to sit on your desk using the coloring pages below. What color would you choose for your sheep? Hint: They can be black, brown, or tan in real life.

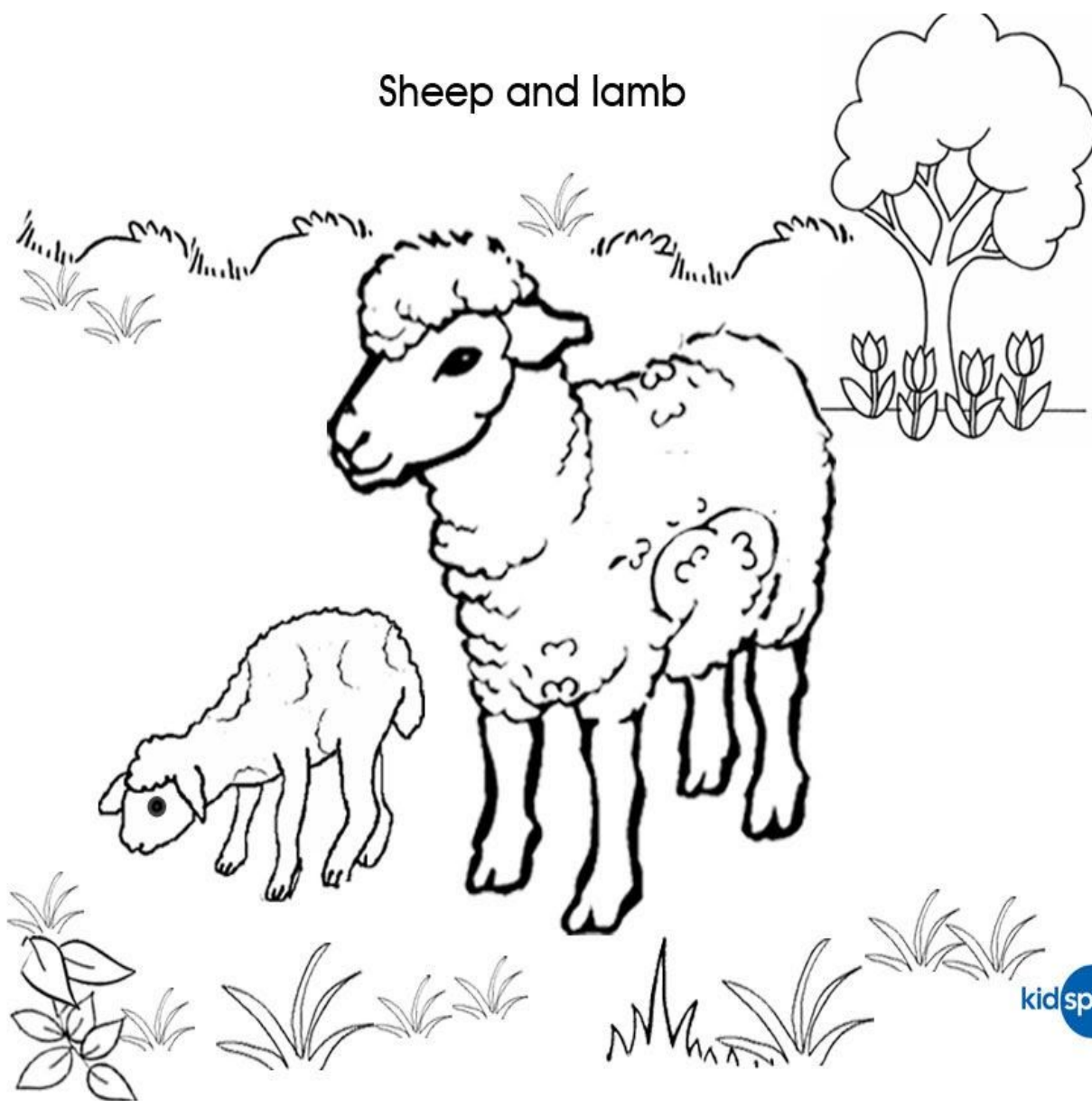

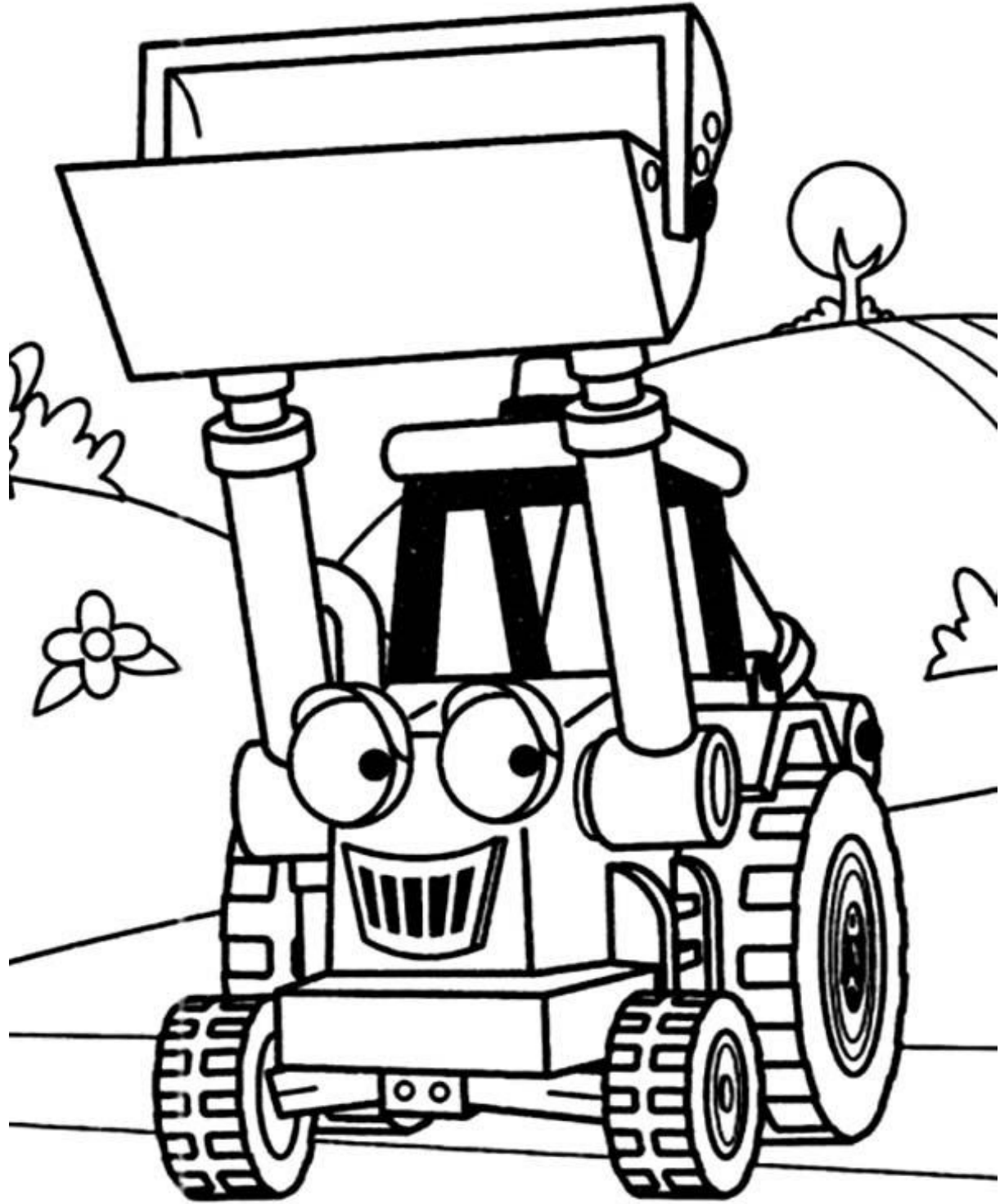
# Sheep

3. Fold in half along the solid line, so your sheep stands up. If you want, draw a picture of a field or farm and use it as a background for your sheep.

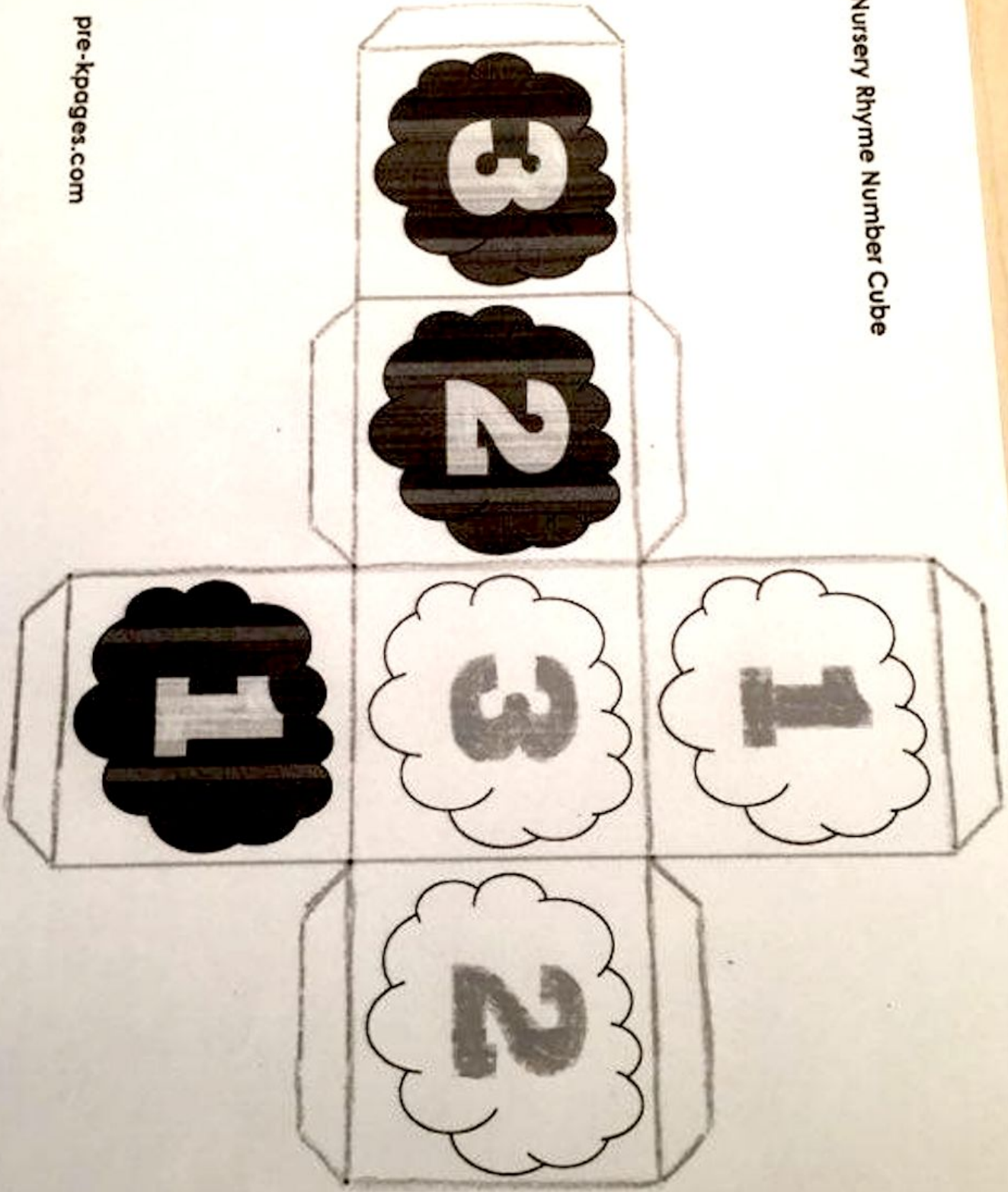


Sheep and lamb

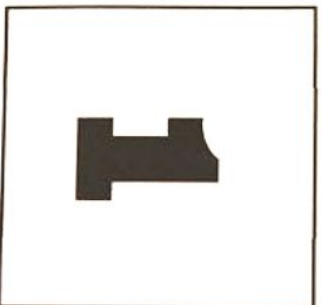




Nursery Rhyme Number Cube



## Nursery Rhyme Bag Labels



### *Instructions for Cube*

Cut out along the outer lines. Fold on all the inner lines. Use a glue stick on the tabs to assemble the cube. (You may want to stuff the cube with scrap paper before sealing the last tab. Reinforce the sides with clear tape.)

### *Instructions for Labels*

Cut out the numbers and tape or glue the numbers to bags.
