

and say hi to her friend, Chickenteague!


Do

- Make your own flower puzzle using the first coloring page below. First, glue the coloring page to a piece of cardboard or construction paper.
- 2. After coloring the flowers, draw lines to create your puzzle pieces like Ms. Travis-Keene did in the storytime video. Finally, cut out the pieces and then have fun putting the puzzle back together!
- 3. Find a recycled plastic cup like an empty yogurt container. Decorate the outside of the cup however you'd like. Then have an adult help you plant seeds in the cup and, over time, watch it grow!
- 4. Check out the coloring pages below on spring and Orioles baseball. What do you like best about spring?
- 5. Practice counting with the baseball glove worksheets. Can you count to 10? Cut the squares out to make a matching game-can you find all of the pairs?

Use these mitt and ball cards to create any kind of matching or sequencing number game.


